## **Message from the PLWA Board of Directors**

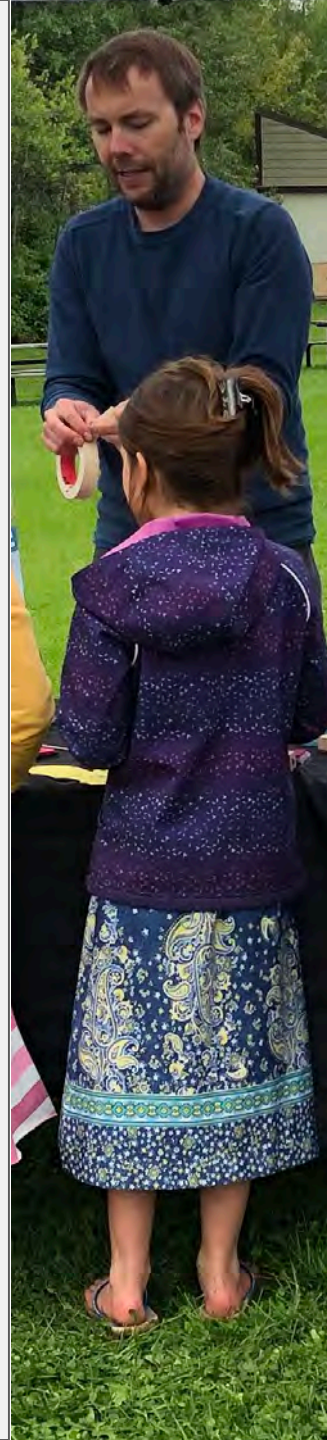
PLWA is focused on improving watershed and lake quality that impacts our collective quality of life at Pigeon Lake.

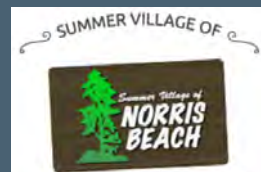

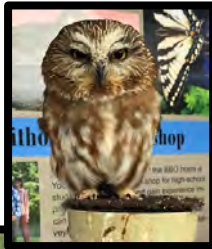
# Caring for our Lake
