



MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



August 1, 2018, my first day on the job, the weather was beautiful, the lake was clear and the community was very welcoming – I feel lucky to be here and look forward to serving this community!

I am impressed by what PLWA, its Board of Directors, staff, and volunteers have accomplished in 2018.

This year the Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan (PL Plan) was adopted. There was lots of community action. A few fun facts...

- 100 plus volunteers gave their time & expertise
- 17 kilograms of native seed was purchased to re-naturalize lots & reduce maintenance
- Hundreds of residents received information on healthy-lake solutions from PLWA staff at the local farmer's markets
- 247 shoreline lots in 3 summer villages were assessed as part of Shoreline Love Your Lake Program
- Thousands of 'cigarette butts' in addition to the excess nutrients that promote algae blooms were blocked from entering the lake through the clean runoff garden at MaMeO

In 2019, the PLWA will continue to plunge ahead to implement the PL Plan. New shoreline rehabilitation projects, a municipal clean runoff drainage guide, low impact landscape guide for developers, collaborating to establish common land-use bylaws, lake monitoring, and stewardship programs are planned.

PLWMP ADOPTED BY ALL MUNICIPALITIES!

The Pigeon Lake Watershed Management Plan or "PL Plan" lays out recommendations to implement to enhance the health of the lake. It is divided into seven topics. All topics are important and interdependent.

The Plan recognizes the lake science, reflects community considerations and meets the government planning standards. It builds on existing initiatives and sets out a road map for future initiatives.

Shoreline Love Your Lake Program

Nature Alberta supported by the PLWA, the Land Stewardship Centre, and Summer Villages of Itaska, Grandview and Norris to coordinated shoreline lot assessments.

- Volunteers contributed their time and boats to take the trained Nature Alberta assessors along the shoreline
- 247 lots assessed
- Reports are expected early in 2019 and will be sent directly to each lot owner
- Some funding in 2019 for shoreline enhancements will be available (more details to follow)








Clean Runoff Actions!

More and more people are slowing and cleaning their water runoff of nutrients and other pollutants before it goes into the lake. The PLWA and Alberta Low Impact Development Partnership continue to evolve the Clean Runoff Action Guide to support changes. AND... in 2019, a Municipal Clean Drainage Guide will support changes to cleaning village and county runoff too!






Riparian Assessment




